

Jubilee Celebration Meeting

Tuesday 15th March, 7.30pm, Keyham Village Hall

Attendees: 12 villagers

Apologies: 7 villagers

Tony Johnson, Chair of Keyham Parish, opened the meeting the purpose of which was to discuss / agree how the village would celebrate this very significant event.

Consensus was for a **Street Party**, the location of which would be from Keyham Allotments up to The Old School House. In conjunction with The Dog and Gun, the date for the street party was set for **Saturday 4th June**. The Village Hall would be available in the event of inclement weather / chill-out area / venue for games and a 'cinema' setting (if practical) showing historical footage of the Queen's reign. A road closure notice would be progressed by Tony Johnson, the deadline for requesting this permission being April 15th.

The Keyham Entertainments Team would be contacted with a view to taking the lead on the street party event. (**Addendum** to the mtg., Sam, Estelle and Jude have confirmed they are happy to go ahead and organise the street party)

Keyham Charities had already pledged their commitment to the event by provision of a celebratory drink.

Separate to the main event of the street party, a number of commemorative features for the village were discussed, those considered worthy of follow up being a tree, trough planters (Tony Johnson, on both) and a plaque for the bus shelter (Christine Hill). Refurbishment of the 1952 bench under consideration too. Tony Johnson stated he is aware of grants of up to £500 being available to support the Jubilee and associated initiatives and he would be progressing that. Deadline for submitting request for that monies by end of March.

Again, and separate to the main event, the PCC are keen for The Church to be decorated and will engage the Flower Group. A flag will be raised / flown from a near-by flag pole in the grounds of Keyham Hall.
