KEYHAM BOOKWORM'S MONTHLY READ HITMAN ANDERS AND THE MEANING OF IT ALL JONAS JONASSON

KN readers may recall Bookworm waxing lyrical about Jonasson's wonderful novel "The Hundred-Year-Old Man Who Climbed Out of the Window and Disappeared" which first appeared in 2009 before being translated into English in 2014. This follow up is equally enjoyable and also as improbable. Jonasson is a Swedish journalist who set up a company to promote sports events and then sold it using the proceeds to fund his first novel, the aforementioned Hundred-Year-Old Man.

This comic tale involves a contract killer, now reformed, some seedy hotels, a female priest without a parish and bags of stolen Swedish Krona as well as a brothel receptionist who has to retrieve a payment due to a hired assassin. KN readers will gather the flavour without too much difficulty! The plot takes us into the dark reaches of Sweden's underworld with comical situations never too far away. As you would expect the brothel receptionist decides to go on the run and what follows is thoroughly enjoyable plot that races to a thrilling climax.

Jonasson has an ability to inject comedy into a fundamentally sound plot involving a variety of unlikely characters. His books are as gripping as they are enjoyable for those who like a good read combined with plenty of humour. Bookworm is no closer to grasping "the meaning of it all" but can recommend Jonasson's latest work if you want a top quality light hearted read.

It's August.... It must be the Pet Service!

There has always been a strong connection between the Christian faith and a love of nature (not unique to Christians of course) there are many Christian Saints who have sought to understand more of God's love through the world around us but the most famous of these must surely be St Francis of Assisi c 1181-1226.

There are many stories of St Francis and the animals but one of the most famous is this: St Francis lifted up his eyes, and saw on some trees by the wayside a great multitude of birds; and being much surprised, he said to his companions, "Wait for me here by the way, whilst I go and preach to my little sisters the birds"; and entering into the field, he began to preach to the birds which were on the ground, and suddenly all those also on the trees came round him, and all listened while St Francis preached to them, and did not fly away until he had given them his blessing. And Brother Masseo related afterwards to Brother James of Massa how St Francis went among them and even touched them with his garments, and how none of them moved. Now the substance of the sermon was this:

My sister birds, you owe much to God, and you must always and in everyplace give praise to Him; for He has given you freedom to wing through the sky and He has clothed you... you neither sow nor reap, and God feeds you and gives you rivers and fountains for your thirst, and mountains and valleys for shelter, and tall trees for your nests. And although you neither know how to spin or weave, God dresses you and your children, for the Creator loves you greatly and He blesses you abundantly. Therefore... always seek to praise God.

I am challenged myself by Francis words and actions, he was a person who loved God and loved others including animals of all shapes and sizes, he lived simply but loved extravagantly, when I came to The Coplow Benefice as Vicar of Hungarton and Keyham, Billesdon, Goadby, Rolleston and Skeffington I was licensed on St Francis day (4th Oct) so St Francis is particularly important to me and I look forward to celebrating once more at our benefice Pet Service in Hungarton – do come and bring your pet (or a photo if the pet won't travel well!) I look forward to seeing you there.

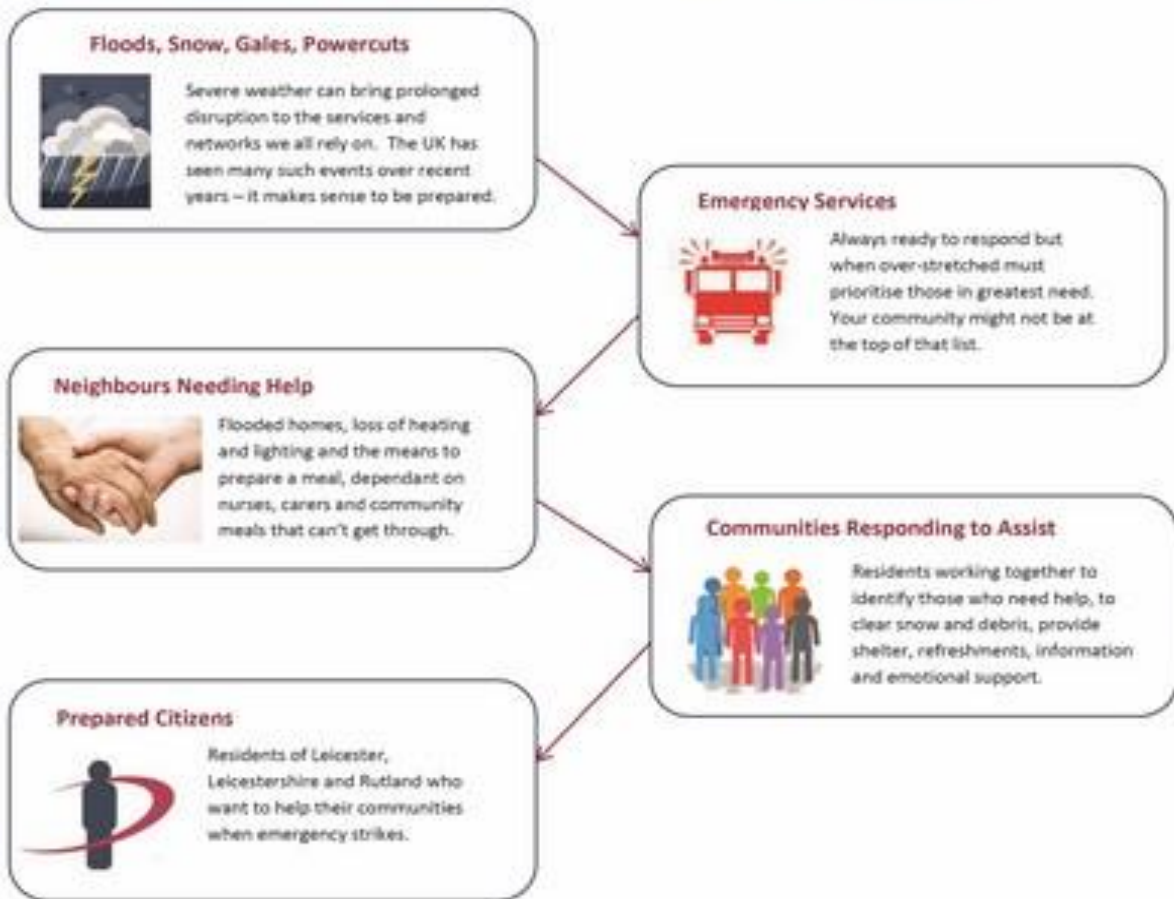

Planning

An update with regard to the gypsy settlement down Hungarton Lane.

As you might imagine, this is a potentially complex planning issue with all sorts of laws and rules associated with the travelling community and is still under consideration by HDC planners. In view of this, and following conversations with a local landowner who has dealt with these types of issues before, I was put in contact with a Solicitor who has a wealth of experience in this area.

After discussing with some members of KCC I made the decision to engage the solicitor to act on our behalf by reviewing the planning case thus far and writing a letter to HDC with his observations.

It is clear from his response that he was able to provide a great deal more detailed input than we were able to. I also asked him to email HDC countering the clearly biased arguments put forward by the Traveller Liaison Officer which you can find at the same link.

Obviously we had to pay for his services, however, the amount was such that I was able to use part of the contingency I have built up in Parish funds without any significant impact to the budget.

In the event that this issue develops negatively such that we believe we must use his services again, in order to achieve a result, then any further potential expenditure would be discussed with the village to gain any authorisation or otherwise.

In parallel I have had further discussions with the landowner and Hungarton Parish Council about them potentially assisting with any further expenditure should the need arise.

Please contact me if you have any concerns or questions about this.

Vandalism

Sadly I discovered last Monday that vandals had pulled out all of the flowers and shrub that I had planted in the tub adjacent to the village sign on Ingarsby Road. No other words necessary.

Rich Sherry to Mr. Ed..... "We had a brief chat recently about some documents we were given when we bought Kerrydale. I have tried to copy a few documents to give you a flavour. There appears to be some history of the owners of lands in Keyham around the turn of the century. Then there are documents regarding the selling lands including West End Farm and then he selling of land within the farm's lands to Penman Builders. This company then built the bungalows in what was New Ingarsby Lane (now Snows Lane). There is extensive mention of a Lewis Thomas Geoffrey Barfoot-Saunt. Do you or any 'historians' within Keyham have any knowledge of him?"

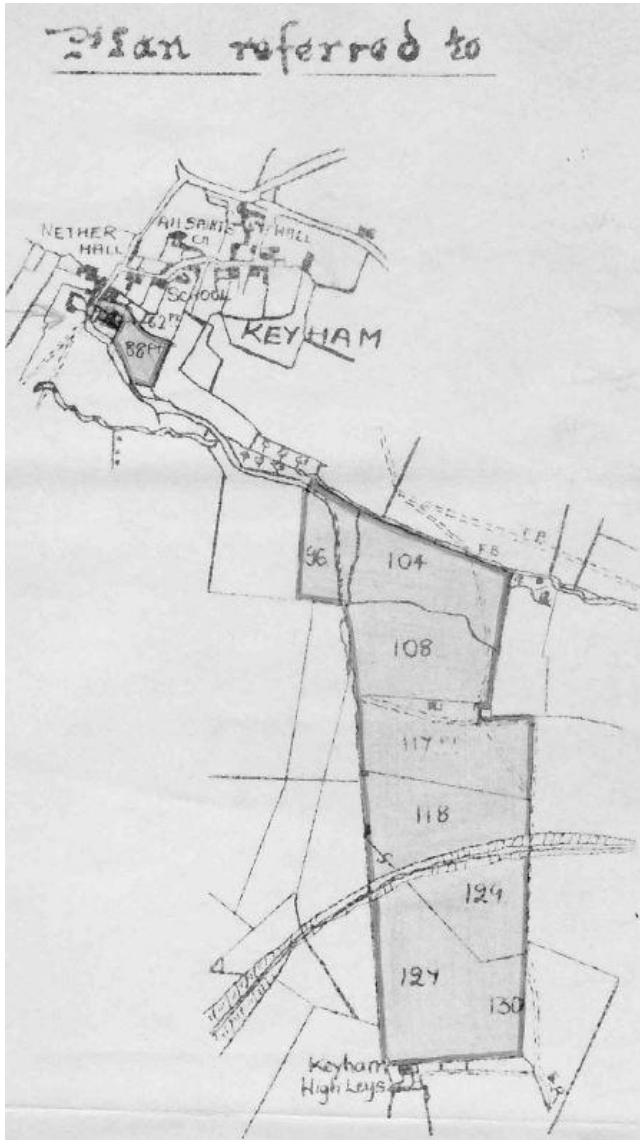
